

Suggested Sequence of Steps to Install Training Rig to Trampoline

1. Slip the uprights (including legs) of the training rig together and place the protruding round tubes of the rig into place in the roller stand receptacles of the trampoline frame. (Some trampolines will need to use the special clamp-on receptacles provided.) Adjust the sliding bushing so round tubes of the rig extend through the tube receptacles just enough so springs from the trampoline bed can be attached to the holes provided. Reattach the spring by hooking to the hole drilled near end of round tube of rig. This keeps the rig from moving away from the trampoline. Do this on both sides. Do not as yet stand the training rig up in the vertical position but let it rest on the floor.
2. Loosen the setscrews on the header (top crosspiece of rig) and slip into place at the end of the uprights still on the floor.
3. Center the larger square tube of the header and tighten setscrews.
4. Install ropes and belt.
5. Using at least four teenage boys or adults, rotate the rig into vertical position. At this time with the rig being steadied in the upright position, loosen setscrews of legs, and let drop till they touch the floor. Then tighten the setscrews.
6. Loop each cable around the side rail of the trampoline near rounded corner. Wrap cable around a couple of times if necessary so it will not tend to move during use of the rig causing slack in the cable. If the cable is wrapped to the outside and next to the last spring anchor on the trampoline frame, it will keep it from moving and thereby become slack. Now install three cable clamps (per each cable). The cable should be pulled up snug. They need not be extremely tight. Before tightening the cable clamps, a person should stand back and sight the uprights of the rig making any necessary adjustments so they will be in line with each other. A level should be used to assure the uprights are vertical.
7. Coil excess cable and tape together to keep out of the way.

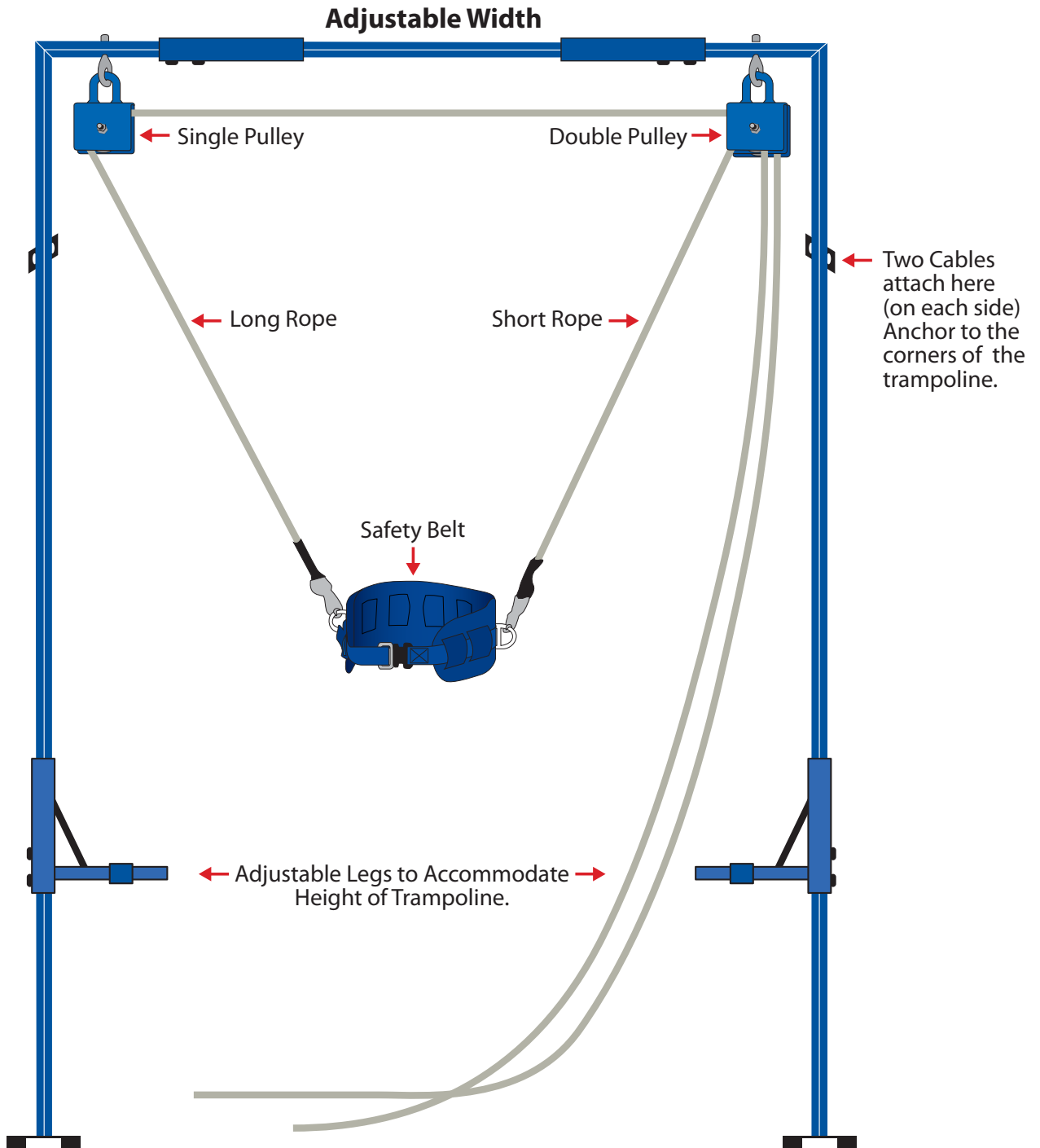
CAUTION

It takes skill to spot a person on the trampoline using the rig. The spotter must know trampolining and be able to instantly recognize when the bouncer is in trouble and then be able to stop him/her in mid-air and lower the person safely to the bed of the trampoline.
